Kangawallafox Flight School Flight Training Scholarship

Scope: This scholarship program has been created to allow one Grade 11 student from the Chinchilla State High School and the Chinchilla Christian College to receive 20 hours of flight training free of charge. 20 hours is the minimum flight experience required to attempt the Recreational Pilot Certificate flight test.

Application Prerequisites:

- Be enrolled in Grade 11 at the Chinchilla State High School / Christian College.
- Have a health standard equivalent to that required for the issue of a private motor vehicle driver licence in Australia. Certain conditions may require a GP assessment e.g. epilepsy; diabetes (Type 1 or 2); a heart condition / disease or paralysis; mental illness (medicated or otherwise); or any other medically significant safety related condition.

Application Process: The scholarship application will open at the beginning of Term 4 and students will have 2 weeks to submit an application form. Parent / Guardian permission is required for the application to be accepted. All applications received will be reviewed by a panel consisting of selected School Staff. This panel will select three students based on the following criteria:

- Does the student display a high level of effort towards tasks and activities, both in and out of the classroom?
- Is the student respectful to school staff and other students?
- Does the student take time to help others when the opportunity exists?
- Does the student take responsibility for their actions?

The three students from each school selected by this panel will then be invited to participate in a trial introductory flight with Kangawallafox Flight School. This free flight will give the students exposure to operating a light aircraft.

The successful applicant of the scholarship program from each school will be announced at the school's annual Awards Ceremony.

Scholarship Inclusions: 20 hours of dual flight instruction in a recreational aircraft.

Scholarship Limitations: The successful student will have 12 months to utilize the scholarship inclusions.

Costs Involved: Additional expenses are required during the training process. A minimum of \$724 will need to be paid by the successful student, as shown below:

- Recreational Aviation Australia annual membership \$199 and one-off joining fee \$30
- Recreational Pilot Certificate flight test \$495

Some students may require additional training to meet the flight test standard. If additional training is required above the scholarship inclusion, this expense will need to be paid by the student.
